Purpose/Process: Tuition & Fees 2016-2017

- Annual process to develop recommendation for <u>Campus Initiated Tuition</u> Increase (CITI) tuition and <u>fees</u> proposal
 - UNC provides guidance
 - Process emphasis: Collaboration, Inclusiveness,
 Transparency, Timeliness, Accountability
- T&F Committee recommends to Chancellor
 - Presented at student forums
- Chancellor reviews and makes recommendation to the WSSU Board of Trustees (BOT)
 - Approval authority--UNC Board of Governors





Tuition & Fees: BOG Guidance (five year plan)

<u>Undergraduate Tuition</u>: Tuition increases for undergraduate resident students limited to 5.0% of current tuition.

- Combined Tuition, General Fees, and Debt Service Fees must continue to <u>remain in the bottom quartile</u> of WSSU's public peer group
- **Non-resident Tuition**: Tuition for non-resident students should be *market driven…that reflect the full cost of providing non-resident undergraduate students with a quality education.*"
 - In Third Quartile of national public peer group
- <u>Graduate Tuition</u>: "The Board ... extends the principle that tuition be set as low as practicable to graduate/professional students as well as those at undergraduate level."





Tuition & Fees-BOG Guidance (five year plan) (cont)

- General Fees (Athletics, Student Activities, Student Health, and Ed Tech) increases must not exceed 5% overall.
- <u>Debt Service</u>: Those fees used to service institutional debt. Excluded from the calculation for maximum
- **Special Fees**, Those that apply to students in particular programs such as nursing, are permitted this year.
- <u>Miscellaneous Service Charges</u>, such as transcripts, ID replacements, late fees, and diplomas, are also permitted.



Tuition & Fees—BOG Guidance 2016-17: Permitted Actions

- Decreases to tuition and general fee rates
- Increases as follows:
 - Debt service fees related to new self-liquidating capital projects
 - School-based tuition for new programs approved by the Board after February 2015
 - Changes requiring only Board of Trustees approval may continue to be made
- All other increases will only be considered in extreme hardship circumstances
